To support the long term planning for Waikōwhai, Kāinga Ora is considering an adjustment to what can be built in certain parts of the neighbourhood.

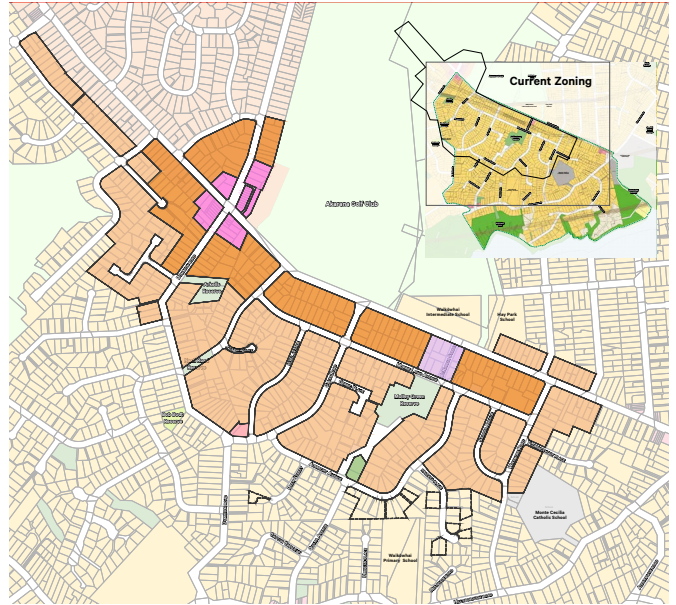
This would involve a formal change to the Auckland Unitary Plan.

The Plan Change would allow for more new homes side by side with strong community spaces and business areas.

Between 20 March and 5 May 2021 we asked for our community's feedback on the proposed plan change in the Waikōwhai and Roskill South neighbourhoods.

- » Enable opportunities for community groups and events.



GETTING AROUND:

- » Improve public transport options.
- » Enable more walkways and cycle ways.
- » Safer streets and walkways for our whānau.



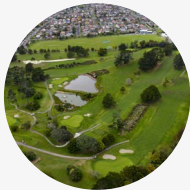
PARKS AND OPEN SPACES:

- » Enable green spaces and plant more trees.

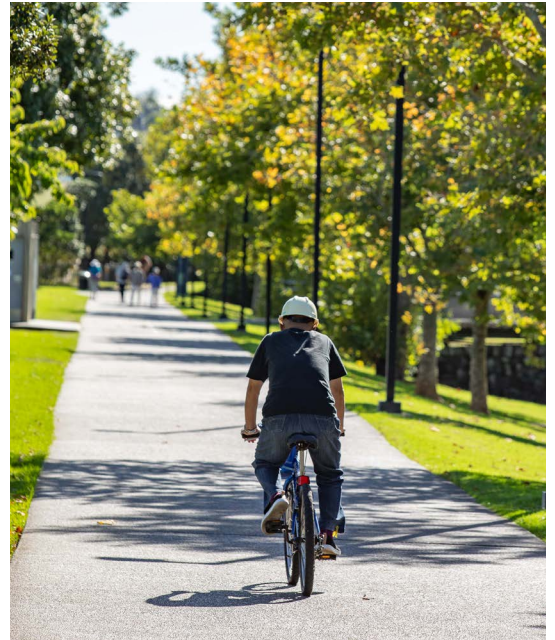
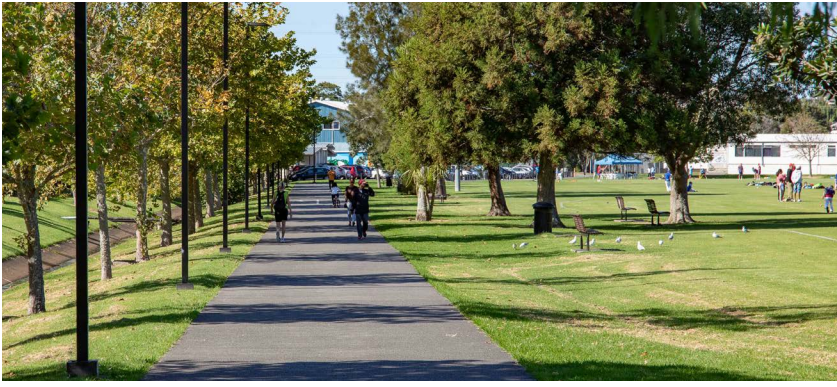


BUSINESS AND SERVICES:

WHAT'S BEEN HAPPENING IN WAIKŌWHAI RECENTLY

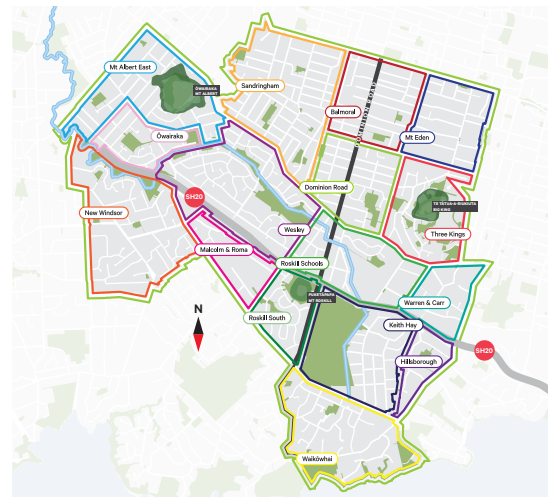
Kāinga Ora has been studying the condition of state-owned land, as well as the condition of ground and pipes in the Waikōwhai neighbourhood. This work is helping to shape a plan for the delivery of new, warm, dry homes. While the long-term plans have not yet been established, we have identified an early opportunity that will allow us to accelerate housing development in a portion of Waikōwhai. This provides a chance to build new, much-needed state housing, while we finalise a broader programme of work later this year.

EARLY OPPORTUNITIES

Over the recent months we have started work on these early opportunities. Kāinga Ora's Tenancy Rehousing Team have started relocating some state home tenants in this small area (refer to reverse side of this brochure for details).

If you are a Kāinga Ora tenant and have not already been contacted by the Tenancy Liaison team, you will not be required to move at this stage.

House removals and land remediation have now commenced. Kāinga Ora's civils work alliance, Piritahi, will carry out this work.
