Call in for a bargain and a chat

New 2 U Op Shop is the Mount Roskill Baptist Church op shop on Richardson Road. The shop stocks an eclectic mix of good quality, secondhand goods: anything from clothing, shoes and jewellery through to books and homeware.

The team at HLC caught up with Dianne Ferguson, the part-time Manager at the Op Shop, and Diane Wichman, who has volunteered at the Op Shop since it opened in 1999.

Both Diane and Dianne say that it's great to see the Mt Roskill South Development team taking local feedback into consideration and making an effort to keep Mt Roskill South residents informed.

"There are monthly BBQs, coffee chats, public meetings and lots of signage. It's great to see that the community is being informed. It's not a case of simply slapping some houses here and there. That's something we really appreciate."

The New 2 U Op Shop isn't just a place to fetch a bargain. It's also a place where members of the community can find a shoulder to lean on and a listening ear.

"Many of our customers are talking about the development," says Dianne. "People come to us because we've built up twenty years worth of trust in this community. This is a safe space." Dianne says that the Op Shop gets all of its information about the development directly from

HLC which they can confidently pass on to their customers.

"We'd like Housing New Zealand tenants who are new to the area to know that this is a space for them too. We are here, even if just for a chat."

Diane says that her reason for being in the shop is her love for the Mt Roskill South community. "People have access to quality goods at affordable prices. It makes a difference to their day-to-day lives. But we couldn't do it without the generous donations from the community. It takes a community to help a community."

Surplus profits and unsold goods find their way back to the community too. Scrap metal is taken to the scrap metal yard for a small amount of money that is donated to charity. Books are donated to the Lion's Book Fair in New Lynn. Golf balls find a new home at the local school golf club. There's even a prayer box initiative for customers who want to submit an anonymous prayer.

The Op Shop was established in 1999. Come January next year, the Op Shop will be 20 years old. When asked if there'll be a celebration, Dianne says, "I guess so, yes. I have put it out to our volunteers for any ideas."

What's happening in Mt Roskill South?


The development will take around six years to complete and will eventually see around 260 older state houses replaced with up to 300 brand new homes for Housing New Zealand. An additional 500-600 new affordable and market homes will also be built in the Mt Roskill South area.

The Mt Roskill South Development team is working to deliver better amenities and infrastructure to the community, including extensive upgrades to Freeland Reserve and greater transport connections to Mt Roskill South.

Minister of Housing New Zealand and Urban Development, Phil Twyford recently paid a visit for Mt Roskill South to unveil the first of the completed Stage 1 homes developed by Housing New Zealand (see photos on page 3) and announce the next steps for the development.

Work on clearing the sites for Stage 1a has now been completed, making way for 81 new warm, dry and healthy homes for Housing New Zealand tenants (and a new information centre). House construction will begin before Christmas. Stage 2 preparations are underway and asbestos removal on the yet-to-be-removed homes has begun. House removal and demolition is expected to begin Oct/Nov.

Stage 2 of the development will see 90 older state homes replaced with 300 new modern homes – 60 of those homes will be Housing New Zealand homes. The remainder will be a mix of market and KiwiBuild homes. Construction will begin mid-2019.

WHAT WILL THE NEW HOMES BE LIKE?

The new Housing New Zealand homes will be designed and built to modern standards. They will include double glazing, insulation, and modern materials and fittings inside and out. Each home will have dedicated off-street parking spaces. All plans go through a design review process to ensure they complement the character of the existing neighbourhood.

WHAT ABOUT THE EXISTING TENANTS?

Housing New Zealand has a dedicated Tenancy Liaison Team that works closely with affected Housing New Zealand tenants. Our Tenancy Liaison Officers support tenants through the entire process – from start to finish – and they work hard to help match affected tenants to suitable alternative housing.

WHAT'S HAPPENING TO THE EXISTING HOUSES?

Old state homes that are no longer fit for purpose will be removed or demolished by an HLC-appointed demolition company. Where possible, we try to remove and relocate the old houses to be reused and to serve a new purpose. If we are unable to remove a house (often for safety or practical reasons) our team will remove any recyclable materials from the soon-to-be-demolished homes.
