# THE NEW ROADS ARE NAMED:

**Ofanoa Lane** – in honour of the Ofanoa whānau who lived for 20 plus years on Freeland Avenue.

**Baitul Lane** - after the small Islamic Centre, Baitul Mukarram Musalla, which has existed for five years at Roskill South shopping centre.

*Herenga Way* – which in Te Reo Māori means connections or ties.

## FREELAND RESERVE STORMWATER AND **AMENITY UPGRADES**

Upgrades to Freeland Reserve's stormwater treatment and public amenities have been underway since November 2020, and we've now started a key stage of work, which involves the construction of three flood walls.

Flood walls are designed to contain and allow for the treatment of stormwater. To create the flood walls, Piritahi will be excavating shallow a trench to capture soil and concrete run off, installing piles and steel formwork, and then pouring concrete to hold everything in place.

Environmental shields and noise barriers have been installed while the flood walls are created, which is scheduled to be complete by mid-August this year.

Earthworks are also underway throughout reserve, to prepare for the construction of paved walkways and viewing platforms, and to enable future landscaping and planting.

Residents living near the reserve may notice large machinery operating in the area, which can cause noise and vibration.

The Freeland Reserve Upgrade is estimated to take about 18 months to complete, and we will continue to keep you updated on our activities as works progress.

Piritahi always do their best to minimise disruption, and are working to Council-approved Noise and Vibration and Traffic Management Plans.

# **DEVELOPMENT PROGRESS UPDATE**

#### Stage 1

18 state homes have been removed or demolished. Construction of 126 state homes is complete and tenants are now settled into their new warm, dry homes. 23 new state houses are currently under construction.

#### Stage 2

Stage 2 will deliver around 260 new market and affordable homes. Approx. 91 older state houses have been removed or demolished and construction of 35 state homes has been completed with 24 more state homes scheduled for completion in mid-2021. 112 market and affordable homes are in construction with up to 150 more homes to start construction this year.



### ESTIMATED DEVELOPMENT TIMELINE

Winter 2021

### Autumn 2021

First complete Stage 3 state homes Stage 1 and 2 state houses complete

> Stage 4 civil works commences

> > More market and affordable homes to start construction and available to purchase off the plans

#### Stage 3

113 state homes have been removed. Over 365 new homes will be built with 45 state homes under construction and a further 50 state homes to commence construction towards the end of the year. 270 new market and affordable homes will commence construction mid/late 2021.

#### Stage 4

Tenant rehousing has begun with house removals and civil works to commence soon. Around 57 old state houses will be removed and replaced with 95 state and 140 new market and affordable homes.
