

BUDDING BUILDERS GET TO WORK AT MAY ROAD PRIMARY

On a sunny Tuesday morning in Roskill South, year one to six students from May Road Primary made their way to the shaded area for the school's second Construction Day since development work began in the area. The children were divided into groups and allocated an activity station manned by members of the Roskill South Development team and Piritahi, Kāinga Ora's civil alliance partner.

Each station had a different interactive activity, designed to educate the children about the work happening in their neighbourhood, and introduce them to the development team. "The development affects May Road Primary School in particular because whanau are actually living through the development, they're right in the middle of it," explains Karla Beazley.

Karla is the Community Engagement and Development Coordinator for the Roskill South neighbourhood, and helped run the Construction Day event.

"The Development team are here today to say hi to the children. This is who we are, this is who you're going to be seeing in your neighbourhood. So it's just doing the friendly neighbour thing." The construction learning programme is also designed to inspire the children who may consider construction and civil-related work as a career choice further down the track. Activities ranged from building the foundation of a home using popsicle sticks, affixing door handles using screwdrivers and nails and learning about the history of Roskill with archaeologist Hans-Dieter Bader.

- "Each activity represents a different possible career opportunity within our development here in Roskill," explains Nigel Chandra, Construction Programme Manager.
- "When a house is taken out and a new house is put in, there's a lot happening, so this gives us an opportunity to create that little awareness, a little seed in our young tamariki to realise the different opportunities available to them, from digging drains to doing programme management or development management."

But above all else, the Construction Day was "about having fun," which on all accounts proved a huge success. Both the teachers and the children at May Road Primary had a blast and the Roskill South Development team are already looking forward to the next Construction Day event in the near future.





A HEADS UP **ON NOISE AND** VIBRATION

Before any construction work that is likely to cause noise and vibration begins near your home, you will be sent a letter by our civils alliance partner, Piritahi. This will include information about the site works, the expected duration of the work and the contact details for the Piritahi team.

These letters are distributed to all residents within 100m of the work, however if you haven't received a letter and believe you are affected by this work, please pop into the Roskill Development Information Centre at 142 May Road, or chat to a member of the Piritahi community liaison team who will be present on the development site.

Site boards will also be visible around the neighbourhood containing the contact details for Project Managers and relevant information about that particular work area.

LITTER BLITZ!


On Wednesday 30 October, tidy Kiwis from May Road Primary School helped members of the development team, Piritahi and other local volunteers clean up the streets of Roskill South with a Litter Blitz working bee. Over 200kg of litter was collected in just over an hour, totaling twelve trolleys worth of rubbish! Way to go, team.

The event was lead by Tread Lightly a not-for-profit organisation that aims to teach Auckland students about the environmental consequences of their everyday lives, and to inspire positive behaviour change to create actual environmental benefits.

ROSKILL SOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRESS UPDATE

Construction of 68 Stage 1 state homes have been completed and tenants are now settled in to their new warm, dry homes. A further 58 state homes are to be delivered by mid-2020.

We have begun construction of 60 state homes as part of Stage 2. These are expected to be complete mid 2020. Construction of the first market and

dable homes include KiwiBuild and long term rental options. Around 50% of the market homes will be in a more affordable price range ie. priced from \$500,000 to \$650,000 delivered under the KiwiBuild programme. affordable homes is due to start in the first half of 2020, and homes for purchase off the plans will be available early 2020.

Stage 3 house removals have begun, with approximately 15 houses to be relocated. Planning and site investigations are underway for Stage 4 and construction is due to begin at the end of next year.
