WAIKŌWHAI NEIGHBOURHOOD PROGRESS UPDATE

Stage 1

Stage 1A public housing construction is underway, with the first eight public homes complete on Glass and Nash Roads and Kāinga Ora customers now settled in. A further 29 public homes are due to be completed by October 2024. Stage 1B civil works are now complete. Stage 1 market and more affordable housing is now in design and will commence construction by mid-2024.

Stage 2

Removal of old houses no longer fit for purpose and relocations are well underway. LEAD Alliance has started land remediation and civil works, which will continue until Q3 2024. Construction of the Molley Green Reserve upgrade is now underway. Waikōwhai is one of several neighbourhoods set to grow as part of the Roskill Development, which is delivering around 12,000 new homes. In Waikōwhai, we're building around 1,200 new, warm, dry, healthy homes – a mix of public homes and homes for sale at market and more affordable prices, such as KiwiBuild.

ESTIMATED DEVELOPMENT TIMELINE

Summer 2023 / 2024

- » Eight more Stage 1 public homes completed.
- » Stage 2 house relocations and removals complete.



- Autumn 2024
 - » Stage 2 infrastructure civil works (excluding the McKinnon St area) and land remediation continue.
 - » Molley Green Reserve upgrade (and Albrecht Basin) continues.
 - » Stage 1 of public house construction continues.

Winter 2024

» Stage 2 infrastructure civil works (excluding McKinnon St area) and land remediation complete.

Spring 2024

» Molley Green Reserve works are almost complete. More public homes to commence construction.

FUTURE SQUAD PITCH IN FOR FOOD FOREST WORKING BEE

Students from four central high schools pitched in to help the Molley Green garden team and Kāinga Ora at a working bee to support the local Food Forest.

The students were part of the Kāinga Ora Future Squad programme, which allows students to learn about the Housing and Urban Development industry, its various pathways and career opportunities from leading professionals within the industry.

"At Kāinga Ora, we are responsible for creating thriving communities through housing and urban development in Aotearoa, New Zealand. This includes looking to sustain or enhance the overall economic, social, environmental, and cultural well-being of current and future generations," says JP Puleitu, Advisor - Youth Placemaking.

Students first did a three-day workshop where they learnt the key stages of the building process. They got to visit their local development site to see the action live and hear from industry professionals about career options. They then shared input into housing and urban development from a youth perspective.

The students went on to volunteer at several Kāinga Ora events and activities, like the Molley Green Food Forest,



where they helped by moving large rocks, mulching, planting and weeding, and the Twilight event in December 2023, where they helped with activities like face painting, art and general setup and pack down.

Opportunities such as these will continue to be available for students to access through the Future Squad programme.
