ÖWAIRAKA PROGRESS UPDATE WINTER 2021

CONSTRUCTIVE KIDS IN ŌWAIRAKA

The Kāinga Ora Construction Plus programme is all about creating opportunities for school children to learn about the large-scale developments happening in their areas.

The Construction Plus team, Nigel Chandra and Katie Dobson, recently set up an engagement day with Ōwairaka Primary and Christ the King Primary, involving a primary group (years four to six) and an intermediate group (years seven and eight).

Members of the Roskill Development team, working in the Ōwairaka neighbourhood, and our partner organisations worked with the students using interactive, hands-on activities designed to plant the seeds (Whakatokia nga purapura) of ideas for possible career pathways in construction or urban development.

There were six stations, run by Piritahi, Pipe Vision, and the Development's project management and urban design planning teams. The students were divided into groups, then rotated through the stations, finding out what each team's day-to-day involvement was within the development, then spending ten minutes engaged in each activity – a fast-moving learning experience is a fun one!

Piritahi ran three of the stations where kids learned the rules of construction quite literally from the ground up. They looked at excavating, the ins and outs of pipework, and how big machinery works – with photo opportunities on a digger to finish with!

Students working at the Pipe Vision station learned about drainage, water mains and wastewater. They tested out the underground cameras used in pipe inspections and clambered into the huge pipe truck that was brought on-site.

Our urban design planners had students thinking like architects and designers by drawing a map of the

neighbourhood, with the first group starting with their own homes. Each group contributed another piece of the puzzle: schools, libraries, hospitals, shops and restaurants to add to the community.

The project management team got the kids looking at the big picture at their station. There's a lot of work to do to make sure all the projects needed to create a new housing development come together at the right times. By the end of the day, students had come to realise that developing a new community requires plenty of planning and collaboration!



ÓWAIRAKA PROJECT UPDATE

The development work in Ōwairaka is being undertaken in stages over five years. Stages 1 and 2 are well underway and we have started working on Stage 3 and 4. The Kāinga Ora Tenancy Rehousing team is continuously working through the relocation process with state housing customers who will be affected by future stages of the development.

*Approximate numbers only. Around 50% of the homes are the more affordable price range (ie. priced from \$500,000 to \$650,000 delivered under the Kiwibuild programme). The total number of new homes delivered to the Ówairaka neighbourhood is around 1,100 homes.

What does your role involve?


Our role involves building long lasting trusting relationships with all key stakeholders, and being the voice not only for the community but also the Construction Team.
